FACES is committed to the health of the BC community on racial justice issues and addressing the inequalities within systems of power and privilege. The organization stimulates dialogue and facilitates the creation of individuals to address their own diversity.

The idea of FACES began in 2002 when two football players discussed their need for a racial justice group on campus. After attending a diversity training session at the university, they became aware of the need for a group on campus to address racial justice issues. About 20 students, faculty members, and administrators were consulted, and in the summer of 2004, Dr. Lillie Albert became the first advisor. She helped organize the students and provided guidance, focus and direction. FACES became an officially registered student organization (RSO) in the same year. FACES received three awards for its efforts: Engaged Student Organization, Creativity Award, and Faculty Advisor.

Since then, FACES has become known for its diversity, equity, and inclusion commitment to education in the BC community. In the past, FACES has participated in events such as the Women's Matter Candidate Visit, and the Race Against...
