FACES is committed to creating a positive space for the BC community on racial justice issues and addressing the ways in which systemic racism perpetuates and reinforces racial inequality.

The FACES team works to stimulate dialogue and facilitate the continuation of education and challenging individuals to address their own biases and prejudices.

The idea for FACES began in 2002, when two football players discussed the need for a more inclusive culture at the University. After attending related lectures on campus, they became interested in forming a group on campus to address racial justice issues. After 12 different meetings, members and administrators were consulted, and in the summer of 2004, Dr. Little Albert became the first Advisor. She helped organize the students and provided guidance, focus and direction. In 2005, FACES received three awards: Creativity Award, and Faculty Advisor.

Since then, FACES has become known for its commitment to anti-racism, education, and action.
